- Skills: Asking for help, giving a reminder

Module 5: The Body & Parts of the Body (Parts 1, 2, and 3)

- Vocabulary: arm, bone, elevate, external, extremities, hand, head, internal, leg, pulse, spinal, wrist, finger, elbow, shoulder, toe, foot, ankle, knee, hip, torso, back, chest, waist, abdomen, groin, neck, shoulder blade, rib cage, small, head, face, eyes, nose, lips, forehead, cheek, eyebrow, jaw, ears

Module 6: Blood

- Vocabulary: bleeding, clot, compatible, plasma, platelet, red blood cell, Type A, Type AB, Type B, Type O, universal donor, full blood count, anaemia, pernicious anaemia
- Skills: Asking about experience

Module 7: The Circulatory System

Module 8: The Respiratory System

- Skills: Talking about consequences, delivering bad news

Module 9: The Digestive System

- Skills: Showing sympathy, explaining a procedure

Module 10: First Aid

- Skills: Providing reassurance, first aid guide

Module 11: Physical Assessment

- Vocabulary: affect, auscultation, body build, consent, demographic, inspection, objective data, palpation, percussion, subjective data
- Skills: Giving instructions, describing steps

Module 12: Recognizing Symptoms

- Vocabulary: ache, cough, fatigue, fever, headache, mild, moderate, severe, sore throat, stuffy
- Skills: Asking/talking about symptoms, describing problems

Module 13: Pain

- Vocabulary: burning, constant, distress, excruciating, intensity, intermittent, sharp, shooting, throbbing, unbearable
- Skills: Talking about pain



Module 14: Common Abbreviations

- Vocabulary: BP, Dx, HR, Rx, T, WNL, XR, SOB, c/o, o/e, HTN
- Skills: Patient evaluation, clarifying information

Module 15: Measurements

- Vocabulary: g, mg, mcg, cc, ml, tsp, Tbsp, gtt, oz, mEq
- Skills: Confirming measurements

Module 16: Medication/Administering Medication

- Vocabulary: antibiotic, antidepressant, antihistamine, anti-inflammatory, dose, laxative, painkiller, sedative, stimulant, suppository
- Skills: Route of administration, dosage, identifying an error, listing options

Module 17: Describing Frequency

- Vocabulary: BID, TID, QID, PRN, stat, qh, ahs, ac, pc, QOD
- Skills: Describing frequency

Module 18: Maintaining Hygiene

- Vocabulary: antibiotic, antimicrobial, bacteria, biohazard, contagious, disinfectant, face mask, infection, quarantine, transmit, virus
- Skills: Giving advice through email communication

Module 19: Nurse Categories (Optional Unit)

- Vocabulary: accredited, bedside, bedsore, certified, degree, electronic health record, injection, license, patient flow, re-order, vaccine, associate's degree, bachelor's degree, demand, factor, hospital-based diploma program, licensed, licensure, exam (NCLEX-RN), Nurse practice Act, registered nurse, shortage, state board of nursing, advanced degree, board certified, counseling, diagnose, immunization, nurse practitioner, physical exam, physical therapy, point of entry, prescribe
